WELCOME from our Musical Director

Welcome to our Christmas concert.

This year we are retelling the nativity through Bob Chilcott's Christmas Oratorio. The Christmas Oratorio is divided into 4 parts, between each we will be singing other Christmas carols.

Part 1 begins the story with the visitation of the Archangel Gabriel to Mary and continues with Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem and the birth of Jesus.

Part 2 describes how the angels tell the shepherds and of the shepherds visit to the newborn Jesus. After our interval the 3rd part tells us of the journey of the wise men, first to Herod, then on to the holy family.

Part 4 concludes the story with the presentation of the now infant Jesus at the temple, where he meets the old man Simeon, who had been promised he would not see death until he had seen the Christ.

In his oratorio, Chilcott sets his own arrangements of popular carols as well as Christmas texts by Percy Dearmer, Christina Rossetti and Robert Herrick. The piece begins and ends with two different translations of the 15th century German hymn 'Es ist ein Ros entsprungen' (usually called 'A spotless rose' in English, literally translated as 'A rose has sprung up'). Written in 2019, the oratorio is a contemporary setting of this well-known story. An 'oratorio' is a musical setting of a story, usually biblical, but unlike an opera or musical, is unstaged and unacted.

In the past he has played for Ingatestone Choral Society, the Canvey Island Community Choir, Essex Police Music Society, Eastwood Chorale, United Singers (Hornchurch) and the Operatic and Dramatic Societies of both Billericay and Southend.

Outside of music he was, until recently, a Borough Councillor for the Liberal Democrats in Leigh on Sea; and is also a steady, rather than spectacular, opening batsman in the lower reaches of the Essex League.

John Pierce, local piano and singing teacher living in Billericay, is originally from Holywell. North Wales.

John studied at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester and continued his advanced training at the National Opera Studio in London, supported by the Welsh National Opera. He represented Wales at the Cardiff Singer of the World in 2011. John has performed at many of the UK's leading Opera Houses and concert venues and has won many competitions and scholarships; these include Young Welsh Singer, Welsh Singer of the Year, the Prince of Wales scholarship, the Susan Chilcott Scholarship, the Countess of Munster scholarship, and the prestigious Elizabeth Harwood Memorial Prize.

Career highlights include performing for the late Queen Elizabeth and Duke of Edinburgh at Buckingham Palace during a reception for Young People in the Performing Arts and performing for HRH Prince Charles to celebrate his 50th year of being the Prince of Wales. In 2018 John was invited to perform at the Water Rats Ball at the Grosvenor Hotel alongside Alfie Boe, Michael Ball, Katherine Jenkins and Rick Wakeman.

Kerry Bassil graduated with a first-class honours degree and the Eric Morris Performance Prize for music from the University of Wales, Bangor. Following her degree, Kerry lived in Auckland, New Zealand teaching flute with children and adults of all ages and abilities. On returning to England, she gained an Advanced Certificate in Dalcroze Music & Movement and took up a post as a music teacher for young people with learning difficulties at a local special school. This combined interest in music and education led to the development of a project entitled The Biggest Little Music Show: a live touring production of music for primary and special schools, Kerry and her colleague, Dave L Cooke (piano) toured hundreds of Essex schools over an 18-year period from 2005-2023, offering inspiration to the next generation of junior musicians. Kerry currently works with pianists, harpists and guitarists for weddings, events and recitals alongside running her own private music teaching studio in Chelmsford.

2. The Angel Gabriel

And in the sixth month the Angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, To a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; And the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel came in unto her and said, Hail, thou that art highly favoured, The Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. And when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: For thou hast found favour with God. And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, And bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end. Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, And the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

In the heav'nly country bright Need they no created light; Thou its light, its joy, its crown, Thou its sun which goes not down: There for ever may we sing Alleluias to our King. (repeat)

And he came by the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him after the custom of the law, Then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said.

And peace on earth to men!'


