Biographies

Ed Sutton Musical Director

Ed received his first organ training under Kenneth Ryder as Diocesan Organ Scholar at St Peter Mancroft, Norwich. He was simultaneously major music scholar at the King's School, Ely. He read music at the University of Edinburgh and continued his studies at the University of Exeter, where he was Ouseley Senior Organ Scholar, researching the choral music of Giovanni Paolo Cima. Since then, Ed has held various organist and choir director positions. He currently directs the Harsnett Choir, the Gibbons Ensemble and Billericay Choral Society. He is half of the duet Keepsake and is an active recitalist, accompanist, and conductor.

Ed left the music world many years ago and took a better paid career in financial services. He currently works in the City of London and lives in Essex with his partner and miniature schnauzer, one of whom also sings with Billericay Choral Society

Alastair Merry Baritone

Alastair studied music at Worcester College, Oxford, became a lay clerk at Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford, and went on to study singing with Laura Sarti at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama.

He has sung several solo operatic roles including the Count in the Marriage of Figaro, Sid in Albert Herring, The Forester in Rusalka and Dancairo in Carmen.

As a professional chorister, Alastair has sung with the choruses of English and Welsh National Operas in over 20 productions, as well as covering and performing a small role in WNO's production of Moses und Aaron. Additionally, Alastair has worked with the BBC Singers, Netherlands Radio Choir and Opera Rara – work which involved multiple radio broadcasts, recordings, and concert performances including at the BBC Proms.

Alastair is also an active oratorio soloist and recitalist, having performed many works including, most recently, Durufle's Requiem, Handel's Messiah, and Vaughan Williams' Five Mystical Songs. He is also a professional Choirman of the Temple Church, London singing twice-weekly services during term time, and appearing in concerts, tours, recordings, and broadcasts with the choir. Based in Galleywood, Essex, Alastair is also in demand as a teacher, working with Primary school children as part of the 'Primary Robins' singing programme, and has several private singing students. In addition, Alastair is an accomplished pianist and accompanist, using his piano skills as well as his voice as part of his music therapy work with the charity Lost Chord.

Philip Prior Organist

Philip graduated from Anglia Polytechnic University with a Bachelor of Education Honours degree and taught for 5 years at Kelvedon Hatch Primary School, with responsibility for Music throughout the school. In 2002, he was appointed Acting Assistant Director of Music at St Cedd's School in Chelmsford, where he continued to teach, leaving in 2007 to pursue a career as a freelance organist and teacher. In 2004, he completed a postgraduate Master of Arts degree in Choral Education at the Roehampton Institute in London, (then part of the University of Surrey). Philip studied organ with Roy Wise, Gillian Ward Russell and Alison Baker, and, in 2021, he was awarded the Associateship of Trinity College, London Organ Recital diploma. Philip held church posts in Hutton, Brentwood, and Billericay before being appointed Director of Music at St Peter-ad-Vincula, Coggeshall in 2004. In 2020, Philip was appointed Director of Music at St James the Great, East Hill, in Colchester, to regenerate and expand the music provision there. Philip has held posts as Musical Director to both Braintree and Halstead Choral Societies, Assistant Musical Director of the London Cantata Choir and, in 2018, was elected President of the Essex Organists' Association. Philip also conducts his own chamber choir, Chorus ad Vincula, which sings as a visiting choir for cathedral services and other events throughout Britain several times each year. He is also a regular supporting organist for choral services at Chelmsford Cathedral and accompanies visiting choirs in other cathedrals, when needed.
