Programme Note

We started the term by looking at Stainer's Crucifixion and other works appropriate for Easter-time that I felt would allow the choir to get to know each other and rediscover their group sound as we emerge from the pandemic. The programme has now ended up having a new meaning in the light of current events. Even with all its dramatic romanticism, the Crucifixion has many poignant moments of reflection. It tells the Easter story in a way more accessible for us now than perhaps any of Bach's settings that it mirrors, as that was its intended purpose. The tenor and bass soloists are the primary storytellers, and the choir dramatizes acting as the crowds and mobs and also singing the work's centerpiece and one of Stainer's most famous anthems, 'God so loved the world'. What I notice most in the five hymns (which require audience participation!) is the emphasis on Jesus's selflessness and sacrifice. I hope we can use this performance as an opportunity to remind us of and reflect on the struggles all across the world.

She completed her undergraduate degree in Music and the University of Bristol; During her undergraduate, she was appointed as the first female Choral Scholar at Bristol Cathedral and conducted the University Chamber Choir in her final year. Ailsa then went on to study for a masters in Solo Voice Ensemble Singing at the University of York with Robert Hollingworth (director of I Fagiolini) and graduated with Distinction. Alongside the Masters, she was a member of the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain Fellowship Programme and held the Leeds Festival Chorus Chorus Master Scholarship. Ailsa then moved to London to pursue a freelance singing and conducting career. She is a current Sing For Pleasure Young Conducting Scholar and sings as a regular soprano at the Tower of London.

Jack was raised in Norwich and Oxford and read a music degree at the University of York, graduating in 2018. He is an alumnus of Genesis Sixteen and the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain Fellowship, and is currently a VOCES8 Scholar. Jack deputises regularly around the London church circuit and often records film and video game soundtracks with London Voices. After a period of work



in music television production, including coverage of the BBC Proms 2021, he is now focusing on a career in singing, and is taking lessons with Gary Coward.

Recent graduate of the Guildhall School of Music and Drama with honours, Welsh-German baritone Thomas Niesser is making a name for himself both in the UK and on the continent. As a soloist he has sung in performances of Elgar's *The Dream of Gerontius* with the Vivace Chorus and Brahms' *Ein*

Choral Society. Recent operatic roles include Dr
Falke at the Schlossfestspiele Ettlingen and the
title character in Don Giovanni with the Berlin
