John Henry Maunder 1858-1920

Born at Chelsea, the son of a carpenter, he attended the Royal Academy of Music. He began his career as a theatre composer, but later specialized in sacred music for the Anglican Church becoming an author and composer, as well as a musician. He was organist at several churches in South London. He wrote church anthems, cantatas, several carols, tunes for around 30 hymns, songs and ballads, services and canticles, two operettas, and six instrumentals, his best known cantata being "Olivet to Calvary".

#### Alastair Merry - baritone

Alastair studied music at Worcester College, Oxford, became a lay clerk at Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford, and went on to study singing with Laura Sarti at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama.

He has sung several solo operatic roles including the Count in the Marriage of Figaro, Sid in Albert Herring, The Forester in Rusalka and Dancairo in Carmen.

As a professional chorister, Alastair has sung with the choruses of English and Welsh National Operas in over 20 productions, as well as covering and performing a small role in WNO's production of Moses und Aaron. Additionally, Alastair has worked with the BBC Singers, Netherlands Radio Choir and Opera Rara — work which involved multiple radio broadcasts, recordings, and concert performances including at the BBC Proms.

Alastair is also an active oratorio soloist and recitalist, having performed many works including, most recently, Durufle's Requiem, Handel's Messiah, and Vaughan Williams' Five Mystical Songs. He is also a professional Choirman of the Temple Church, London singing twice-weekly services during term time, and appearing in concerts, tours, recordings, and broadcasts with the choir.

#### John Pierce - tenor

John, local piano and singing teacher living in Billericay, is originally from Holywell. North Wales.

John studied at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester and continued his advanced training at the National Opera Studio in London, supported by the Welsh National Opera. He represented Wales at the Cardiff Singer of the World in 2011. John has performed at many of the UK's leading Opera Houses and concert venues and has won many competitions and scholarships; these include Young Welsh Singer, Welsh Singer of the Year, the Prince of Wales scholarship, the Susan Chilcott Scholarship, the Countess of Munster scholarship, and the prestigious Elizabeth Harwood Memorial Prize.

Career highlights include performing for the late Queen Elizabeth and Duke of Edinburgh at Buckingham Palace during a reception for Young People in the Performing Arts and performing for HRH Prince Charles to celebrate his 50th year of being the Prince of Wales. In 2018 John was invited to perform at the Water Rats Ball at the Grosvenor Hotel alongside Alfie Boe, Michael Ball, Katherine Jenkins and Rick Wakeman.
